# Reception Medium Term Planning Spring Term 2025

Children can identify and describe homes that they and people live in, in different parts of the world. To know why and how people celebrate Easter and spring symbolising the new life.

Has a good understanding of story structure and can retell and make up own stories using vocabulary that has been learnt. Identifies non-fiction texts, remembering facts.

Reads books with a range of Phase 2 and 3 cvc words and tricky words and shows a good understanding of what has been read. Reads all Phase 2 and 3 tricky words. Says the sound for each Phase 2 and 3 grapheme.

Writes lower case letters correctly using a tripod grip.

Says the sound for each Phase 2/3 grapheme.

Writes cvc words and labels using Phase 2 and 3 phonemes.

Spells some tricky words.

Starts to write short sentences.

Uses finger spacing between words.

Reads sentences back to an adult.
